Fellowship with the Holy Spirit

2 Corinthians 13:14

We are to have fellowship with the Holy Spirit.

John 16:5-7

Jesus says, "It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you."

Peter WITHOUT the Holy Spirit

- Peter walks on water, but then takes his eyes off Jesus and becomes afraid and sinks. Jesus says, why did you doubt?
- When Jesus tells them He will be killed, Peter says, Far be it from you, Lord. This shall not happen to You. Jesus says, get behind me Satan for you are not mindful of the things of God.
- Peter talks about his ideas at the transfiguration and, while he is still speaking, a voice from the cloud says, This is My beloved Son in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!
- Jesus, in distress, asks Peter to pray with Him, but he sleeps.
- When Jesus is being taken, Peter takes out a sword and slices off the ear of the soldier. Jesus says, put it away, for this must happen for scripture to be fulfilled.
- Peter tells Jesus he would never deny and would go to prison and death. Jesus prophesies Peter's denial of Him.
- Peter denies knowing Jesus three times.

John 14:17-18

Jesus says, "The Spirit of Truth... dwells with you and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans."

Acts 2:38-39

Receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit is a promise to those who are called.

Luke 11:11-13

We should ask to receive the Holy Spirit. Receiving the Holy Spirit is likened to receiving our most basic need.

Galatians 3:2-3

Receiving the Holy Spirit is based on faith and belief, not works.

Peter WITH the Holy Spirit

- Peter speaks in tongues.
- Peter preaches the gospel and boldly proclaims that they put Jesus, the Messiah sent by God, to death.
- Peter offers them forgiveness of sin through baptism.
- Peter heals a man who is asking for alms and is lame.
- Peter preaches Jesus and repentance.
- Peter arrested and threatened.
- Peter knows Ananias and Sapphira lied to the Holy Spirit.
- People wanted Peter's shadow to pass over them to heal them, and all the sick and demon
 possessed are healed.
- Peter beaten for preaching Jesus and he rejoices in it.
- Peter receives a vision from God.
- Peter told by the Spirit to go with people at his door.
- Peter given discernment of vision, Gentiles receive the Spirit.
- Peter's chains fall off and he is freed from prison by an angel.

The Holy Spirit spoke to and directed the disciples.

We are not to grieve the Holy Spirit.

We are not to quench the Spirit.

Luke 12:8-12

He who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven.

- ...will testify of Jesus (John 15:26)
- ...will convict you of sin (John 16:8-9)
- ...will convict you of righteousness (John 16:8, 10)
- ...will convict you of judgment (John 16:8, 11)
- ...will guide you into all truth (John 16:13)
- ...will not speak on His own authority (John 16:13)
- ...will speak to you as He hears from God (John 16:13, 1 Cor 2:9-10)
- ...will tell you things to come (John 16:13; 2 Pet 1:20-21)
- ...will glorify Jesus (John 16:14)
- ...will teach you all things (John 14:26)
- ...will bring to your remembrance all things that I [Jesus] said to you (John 14:26)
- ...helps in our weaknesses (Rom 8:26; Zech 4:6-7)
- ...makes intercession for us (Rom 8:26-27)
- ...will teach you what to say when the time comes (Luke 12:11-12)
